SAFETY REMINDERS

- #1 The list of participating students should be provided to the Principal R. Faisal and the District Office prior to the trip.

***Please review these rules with your child before the field trip.**

All FDIA field studies/trips are considered an extension of the school and as such, students on these trips will be expected to follow school rules

Don't get reckless on the bus. You don't want your day to end early, do you? Misbehavior on the bus can get you into trouble and ruin your day. You could end up sitting on the bus while the others enjoy the destination.

Respect the Teacher Leaders & Chaperones. You should respect any chaperones and listen to them as you would your own teacher or parents. Chaperones have a big responsibility, watching after so many students at one time. They can't afford to give too much attention to one "squeaky wheel," so they will probably be intolerant to distractions. Don't be disruptive

Violation of Student Code of Conduct. The Teachers/Chaperones are in-charge on all field studies/trips and have the final authority and the right to discipline* any students who are breach of these rules.

Douglass Non-Negotiables: fighting, inappropriate language, loud talking, inappropriate laughter, physical intimacy, rough housing, horseplay, running, or other actions capable of causing accidents or physical harm to self or others.

Don't wander off. Listen carefully when the teacher gives instructions about sticking with the group or sticking with an **assigned partner**-even when going to the restroom. Don't ever wander off on your own, or your trip could end badly. If you break this rule, you could end up with the teacher as your partner!

Respect nature & artifacts. Some field trips will take you into contact with animals, plants, or valuable objects. For your own safety, be mindful of potential dangers and don't assume you can tug, pull, tease, or touch things safely.

Keep an eye on the clock. If you are supposed to meet your group for lunch or for loading onto the bus, you should keep an eye on the time. You don't want to miss lunch, and you surely don't want to be left behind.

I hold the expectation that all Douglass Scholars will conduct themselves in a manner worthy of emulation by students attending other schools and academies. We set the standard others aspire to reach.
